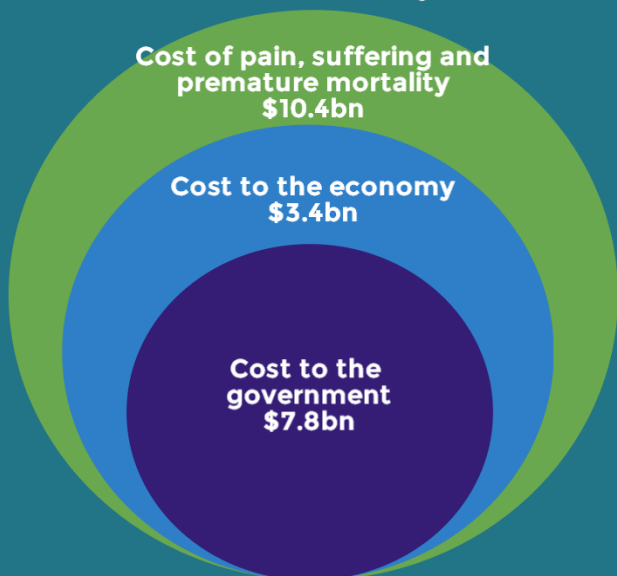


THE COST OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Violence against women costs \$21.7 billion a year



If no action is taken to prevent violence against women, costs will accumulate to \$323.4 billion over a thirty-year period (2014/15 to 2044/45)

Between 55 to 70% of women in the workforce have or are currently experiencing violence in the home.



Every year, an average of 149 female victims of family violence lose their jobs because of family violence.

25% of Australian single parents live below the poverty line. Australian women make up 82% of Australian single parents.



Family violence cost employers an estimated \$175 million per annum

Absenteeism, as a result of family violence, cost employers \$106.6 million per annum, and victims \$25.3 million



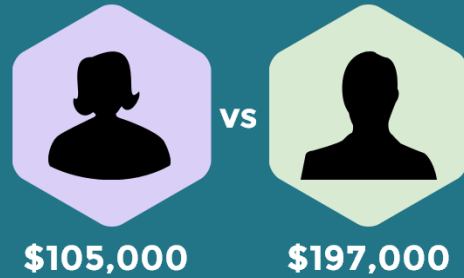

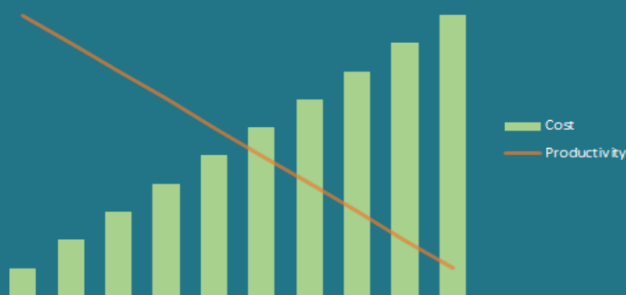
In Australia the Gender Pay Gap is at 18%.

Sexual harassment accounts for \$22,500 per person in lost productivity

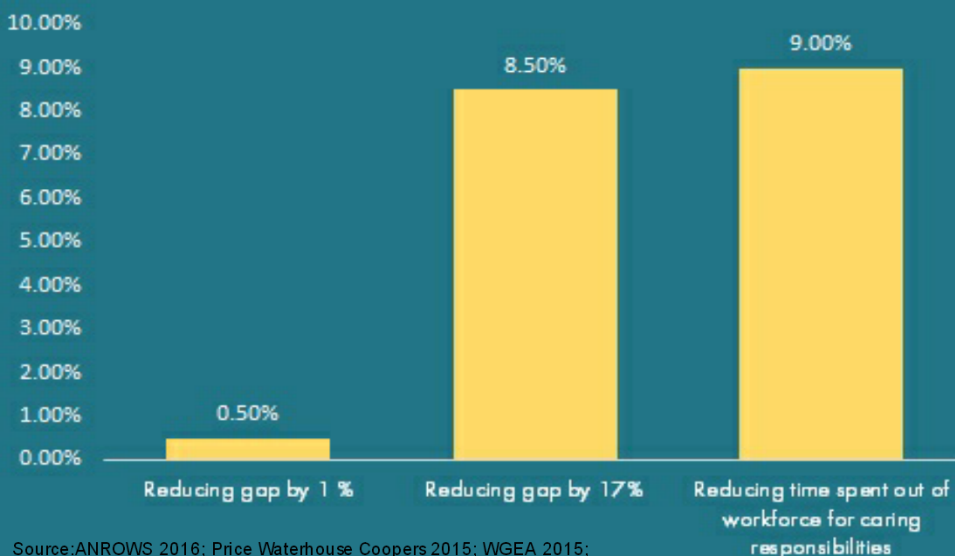


58% of women in the workforce report experiencing harassment
